- 1. How would you describe your participation at the IGF meeting? (max. 150 words)**

**IMHO, it was really great. I really enjoyed attending the sessions. It was my first IGF and certainly, it will not be the last. In particular, I enjoyed learning more about what others thought of the report “the age of digital interdependence”. In some opportunities I acted as a simple observer trying to understand others perspectives. However, in several situations I exposed my opinions and suggestions. As you know, I’m member of the panel that wrote this report.**

**As my first IGF, I had the opportunity to interact with police makers from different parts of the globe. In particular, it was great to connect with the Brazilian ones. I was invited to give some talks at different places in Brazil in the next months. Besides, I had the opportunity to clarify some of the recommendations that appear in our report "the age of digital interdependence", specially related to human rights to some policy markers. I believe having convinced the Brazilian police-makers about the importance of our work. I hope they engage in the implementation of some recommendations in the near future. I got very surprise with the quality of the IGF and also with the Brazilians participation. I made several connections with human rights defenders. I hope these connections can flourish in the near future becoming a strong partnership. I attended several sessions related to the discussions of our report recommendations, like 1) UN Human Rights, UN Global Pulse and Access Now: Consultation on the report of the UN Secretary-General's High-Level Panel On Digital Cooperation (recommendation 3a) 2) Conclusions of European stakeholder consultation on the report "The Age of Digital Interdependence", etc. Regarding the improvements, I believe our recommendation for an IGF plus is very opportune and can bring a lot of benefits for the global society.**
