Dynamic Coalitions (DCs)



Dynamic Coalitions Guidelines: Through a bottom up process DCs guideline has been modified to a comprehensive version:




- 1. Identification of DCs end year expected outcomes.
- 2. The outcomes should be a demonstration of DCs activities through-out the year;
- 3. The annual report should not be confused with DCs individual session report and substantive output DCs collectively produce;
- 4. A clear timeframe for submission of the report;



IGF 2019 Dynamic Coalitions Annual Reporting



DCs Proposals:

16 recognized DCs submitted their proposals for individual slots during IGF 2020:



DCs Main session:

- DCs have started collaborative work on their main session for IGF 2020;
- DCs main session in 15th IGF will address COVID 19 pandemic and it's impacts on the work of the DCs;
- Ahead of the DCs main session, interested DCs will submit a substantive one page paper about how the pandemic affected their work, and the lesson learned through the Pandemic;
